When mounting fishing regulations prevented them from making a living, they turned to marijuana smuggling to survive. Outlaws of the Everglades...a story of loyalty, survival, determination and grit.

Outlaws of the Everglades is a documentary about people & what happens when they have to make a decision between what's legal, and survival. We explore why men who made their living fishing their whole lives, began smuggling marijuana. Set in Chokoloskee and Everglades City, Florida - Kent Daniels, Darrel Daniels, Carl Hiaasen, Bobby Weeks, Tim Chapman Joyce Daniels, Steve Markley and more, tell the story. The biggest story to come out of this area, we find out what happened, from beginning to end. In the 1930s and 40s, during the formation of the National Park, promises were made that commercial fishing would never be endangered. When those promises were slowly broken, the fisherman made their choices... and lived with the repercussions.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

This film began shortly after our producer, Brian Holaway called in May of 2021, excited about a former marijuana smuggler in the Everglades he'd been speaking to. He wanted to capture some of the man's stories on camera. I asked if we could meet him first. A date was set & off we went. When we met Kent Daniels, I was in awe of his storytelling ability. He was a master, to say the least. He told stories of smuggling and family. Of injustice and loss. He stressed neither he nor his family ever wished to discuss what they'd done publicly, but for a number of reasons, he wanted to speak now. It was inspiring, and I knew then we had to tell the whole story.



The early vision was simple: have several former smugglers tell their stories & weave them together while including the beauty of the area as its own character. Everglades City and Chokoloskee, Florida, have such a unique look and feel. The goal was to find out why they felt forced to smuggle. But the vision & scale grew quickly. We needed to tell a full story of what happened there, beginning to end. We needed to include non-smugglers, wives, mothers, law-enforcement and journalists. We needed to hear if there were opposing views on the situation. In the 1970s and 80s, this was the biggest story to come out of this area. Empires were built here. The more we heard, the more we wanted to hear.

The main challenge was gaining trust. Everglades City and Chokoloskee are insular communities. They've been through much and don't trust easily. If we didn't have Kent vouching for us, we'd have spoken to no one. But even with his assistance, we had to convince each person we were trustworthy, and not there to do harm. We also had an incredibly small crew. But, after three years of filming and a year of editing (with hurricane Ian mixed in) we ended up with a story we're proud to tell. For me, it was the greatest adventure of my life. Along the way, we met incredibly interesting people and had unforgettable experiences. I hope people are moved by the stories they hear and the people who tell them. I hope they come away with an understanding of these people and why they felt the need to do what they did.

DEBI LEWIN



INTERESTING FACTS

Chokoloskee and Everglades City are very small communities on the edge of the Everglades with a unique culture and population of about 900 people. Outsiders are not easily brought into the fold. Earning their trust took over a year. You just don't roll into town and say you want to do a documentary on their past smuggling life. A big part of this production was earning their trust and loyalty which included more than a year of weekly conversations with Kent Daniels. Once those were earned the filming began.


CHALLENGES

Challenges occurred in the making of this film were, waiting on tides, sunsets and weather. Sometimes we would travel 82 miles down to do an interview and find out that something had come up with the interviewer so we would try another day. During the campfire filming one of the interviewees just said, "I'm done" and walked off. So we were done. Personal challenges for our Producer were trying to schedule and coordinate time with Rob, the Director, for filming since he worked as a full-time guide and honestly this is my first time producing, I had a lot to learn in the process.

A major challenge was switching to a new executive producer, Ron Greenbaum, mid-stream and getting everyone on board and moving forward with this project.

We had continue to earn the trust of residents of that area over the entire process of the making of the film. We also had to earn the trust of additional interviewees (Ron, Tim, Carl etc...) who came into the process after it began to grow into a larger project.

Hurricane IAN also occurred which impacted everyone in Southwest Florida.



RESEARCH

Research was done many ways, we used newspapers.com as well as the extensive library the Producer/Assistant Director collected over a 30-year period on the subject.

We also brought in Barbara Lindstrom to help with research; we were fortunate and grateful to have such talent helping with this project. Our team read a number of locally written history books, and watched several local PBS documentaries on Chokoloskee and Everglades City during our research. We received almost every bit of historical b-roll and photos which appear in the film, from interviewees in the film. A process which went on right through the final days of editing the film.

ACCESS

Honestly, Kent Daniels, was a key component in helping us with logistics and access to interviewees as well as remote spaces or places we wanted to film at. Many days were spent on boats in isolated areas of mangrove forests, some days with the ever-approaching rainstorm behind us or at night with dark starlit skies. We would not have been allowed any of this if it were not for the trust they had in us.
